The purpose of these requirements is to maximize the integrity and quality of this event and remain aligned with values of holistic sustainability and ethical food.

A Note To All Vendors: If the organizers of VegFest Oahu see that you are selling or distributing products/food that are against the vegan/sustainability guidelines stated here, we reserve the right to ask you to stop serving those products and/or to ask you to leave the event.

NON-FOOD VENDORS:

Requirements for Vegan Products & Sustainable Packaging

- VegFest Oahu is a vegan event. Vendors must adhere to the requirements:
 - You must not sell leather, silk or any other animal-based textiles.
 - You must not use any animal products or byproducts in the products you sell or distribute (e.g. honey, whey, milk, butter, casein, etc). For beauty products, common animal-based by-products are: carmine, beeswax, guanine, lanolin, and collagen. If in doubt, PLEASE ASK US!



- VegFest Oahu is a plastic-free event (no single-use plastics). We ask that vendors provide:
 - Reusable products AND packaging rather than disposable if possible.
 - If disposable products are used, they must be <u>100% certified</u> <u>compostable</u>. Look for this logo on products:



- This includes bags, packaging, bottles, sample cups/spoons, etc. Plastic-free means no styrofoam or other single-use plastics (plastics labeled #1-6 are single-use). Compostable "plastics" are allowed if they are certified compostable. Napkins can be either compostable or made with at least 80% post-consumer recycled material.

FOOD VENDORS:

Requirements for Vegan Food & Sustainable Tableware

- All food (meals, samples and beverages) served must be vegan. This means all
 the plant-based foods you wish, but absolutely no animal products (no meat, fish,
 milk, cheese, butter, eggs, dairy, honey, gelatin, lard, beeswax).
- We encourage all food to be sourced locally and organically whenever possible.
- This is a plastic-free event (no single-use plastics). Vendors must adhere to the requirements:



 Use reusable tableware if possible. If disposable foodservice products are used, they must be <u>100% certified compostable</u>. Look for this logo:



This includes bags, plates, cups, lids, take-out containers, stir sticks, straws & food packaging. Plastic-free means no styrofoam or other single-use plastics (plastics labeled #1-6 are single-use). Compostable "plastics" are allowed if they are certified compostable. Napkins can be either compostable or made with at least 80% post-consumer recycled material

- WHERE TO FIND: compostable tableware can be purchased online or at Diamond Head Distributors in Kalihi at wholesale prices: https://www.yelp.com/biz/diamond-head-distributors-honolulu
- Either provide no straws or provide straws only upon request. Straws must be paper or compostable - paper straws can be found online at http://www.aardvarkstraws.com and compostable straws can be found at Diamond Head Distributors. You are welcome to sell reusable glass or stainless steel straws at VegFest Oahu.
- You may not sell or distribute single-use plastic water or beverage bottles, but you can sell or distribute food or beverages in glass, aluminum, paper and other non-plastic materials.
- We ask that you use bulk dispensers for sugar, salt, pepper, creamer & other condiments to avoid waste from single-use serving packaging.
- Sampling: Please do not use plastic containers or utensils for sampling.
 You are welcome to use reusable, paper or compostable products to sample any of your products.
